

# **New Weighing Equipment**

Costain Jacobs are the main contractor on the A1 Birtley to Coal House road improvement scheme. They connected us with the National Highways Social Value Fund to which our volunteer Warehouse Manager, Rob Brotherston then made a successful grant application. They donated over £8,500 to Gateshead Foodbank; this funding has provided us with essential equipment to weigh, stack, label and organise food donations.

After seeing Costain's generous donation, Gateshead-based weighing specialists, Northern Balance, donated a roll-on floor scale to Gateshead Foodbank. This much needed piece of weighing equipment not only reduces the risk of physical injury to volunteers by removing the need for manual crate lifting, but also speeds up the distribution process.

#### **Diversity**

Diversity are a London based street dance troupe formed in 2007. They rocketed to fame when they won the third series of Britain's Got Talent in 2009, beating Susan Boyle in the live final. They are currently in the middle of a



national tour, called Supernova and appeared over two nights at the Glasshouse, Gateshead (formerly the Sage).

Diversity are supporters of our umbrella organisation, the Trussell Trust and their fans were invited to bring along food donations for Gateshead Foodbank on the first night at the Glasshouse and for Newcastle Foodbank on the second night. We received 40 KG of donations together with over £100 which fans donated after the event. Some of our volunteers were invited to meet members of the group backstage before the event, as shown in this picture.

# **Metrocentre Ice Rink**

The Metrocentre has an ice rink each November and December. They invite customers to make a donation to use the ice rink and last Christmas Metrocentre picked Gateshead Foodbank as their chosen charity. They also encouraged customers to drop off food items. They raised an amazing £4,244 as well as almost 60 kilogrammes of food. Thank you to Metrocentre and all of the ice rink customers for their kind generosity.



#### Latest Statistics and......Carrier Bags!

Between 1 January this year and virtually the end of February, we gave out emergency food parcels to 1,240 people across our three distribution centres in central Gateshead, Birtley and Blaydon. They were made up of 852 adults and 388 children. 34 of the adults were aged 65 years or older, while 124 of the children were aged up to four years old. Sadly, it doesn't matter how old or young you are, you can still experience hunger on a daily basis.

On a more positive note, during December we gave out Christmas hampers to all Foodbank users, in addition to the usual provision of nutritional food, toiletries, fresh and frozen food and bread. In total, we provided 374 hampers across our three sites. It was a logistical challenge to make up each hamper and to transport them and we couldn't have achieved this without our amazing volunteers. However, Foodbank users were delighted to receive a hamper on top of the emergency provisions which we usually provide.

Finally, we should like to make a plea for strong carrier bags for us to use when we make up emergency food parcels. If you have any spare bags for life or can donate new bags then please leave them in the collection points or call us for further information.
