# Breaking Barriers to Poverty – And Smashing Targets!

Since July 2022, Gateshead Foodbank has teamed up with Citizens Advice Gateshead (CAG) to do more than just provide food — we're tackling poverty at its roots. At the heart of this mission is Jana Pokutova, our incredible Social Welfare Advisor, offering expert help with debt, budgeting, housing, and employment.




#### And the Results? Outstanding!

In just 12 months, Jana helped service users gain a staggering £**764,114** — that's £389,114 over target and £312,000 more than last year! She also secured £**134,400** in debt write-offs, changing lives and restoring hope.

Over the first three years of her appointment, Jana has secured over £1,000,000 in financial gains plus £233,000 in debt relief orders and £864,000 in debt management for 900 individuals.

Jana's become a vital part of our team, working hand-in-hand with Distribution Manager Lesleyann Watson and our amazing volunteers to ensure every visitor gets a warm welcome and the right support.

Trussell funded Jana's role for the first two years, and split the funding 50/50 with Gateshead Foodbank for the third year. In the current year (Year 4), the Postcode Lottery is funding 50% of Jana's role and Gateshead Foodbank is funding the other 50%. We sadly don't have any future funding for the following year. Financial funds are greatly needed to deliver such essential and effective service to those who are struggling to afford basic essentials and move on from using foodbank.



Together, we're not just feeding people — we're helping them thrive.



### **OUR PARTNERSHIP WITH GATESHEAD LEISURE**

You will remember that Gateshead Leisure Centre was forced to close in July 2023 following Government cuts to the Council's budget. The charity, Gateshead Active Ltd is proud to have reopened the Leisure Centre on 14th June 2024 for the benefit of the local community, ensuring that this vital facility remains a welcoming and inclusive space for health, wellbeing and connection.

It has a gym, pool, soft play and numerous fitness classes. But it's more than just a fitness facility - it's a vibrant community hub where everyone is embraced and included.

As part of their ongoing commitment to community support, they're working with Gateshead Foodbank to help local families in need. The Leisure Centre now serves as a food donation drop-off point, making it easier for members of the public to contribute essential items.

In addition, and as reported previously, Gateshead Active has donated over £600 worth of free activities to the Foodbank to support children and families, including:

- Free swimming sessions
- Free soft play passes
- Café vouchers for use in the centre

These donations have brought moments of joy, relief and connection to families facing difficult times. The Leisure Centre will be running this initiative again this Christmas, continuing their mission to uplift and support those who need it most in our community.

They also run their Chatty Café every Tuesday from 11am to 1.30pm which everyone is welcome to join and receive a free hot drink. The Chatty Café is a weekly community wellbeing initiative developed and hosted at Gateshead Leisure Centre. It provides a welcoming space for all residents in Gateshead to engage in supportive conversations around mental health, physical health, wellbeing and social inclusion. The project brings together GP services, peer mental health supporters, NHS social prescribers, DWP disability employment advisors and other local agencies to offer holistic support through informal café chats, combined with fare-share food offerings and a data bank to offer additional IT support for those in digital data poverty.

Together, we're building a stronger, healthier Gateshead.

# Local Organiser Updates by Diane Kindred, Local Organiser



At Gateshead Foodbank, we aim not just to provide food and support, but to empower communities and challenge injustice. That's where my role as the Foodbank's first Local Organiser, appointed in April last year, comes in.

My work focuses on connecting with people who have lived experience of poverty, building community groups and supporting them to campaign for change. Since starting, I've been listening, facilitating dialogue with decision-makers and helping groups grow in confidence. Here are a few highlights:

#### **Shipcote Residents Association**

This thriving group now chair their own meetings, organises litter picks, and works closely with councillors. Recent wins include new dog fouling signs, extra bins, CCTV and bollards to improve safety.

#### **Lobley Hill Community Action Group**

With a new logo and growing membership, this group successfully brought attention to poor bus services through a BBC-featured petition. They've engaged councillors and secured pledges to improve neglected areas.

#### **Highfield House Residents**

This group is campaigning for fairer pricing and access to value products at local Tesco Express stores, highlighting the critical role of rural convenience shops.

These are just the beginning. Communities in Gateshead are showing their power to organise, influence, and create lasting change.
